GENERAL CONDITIONS AND RULES

1. ALL ENTRIES CLOSE ON JUNE 3rd 2011.
2. Printed Entry Forms can be obtained from the Secretary and no entry will be accepted except on Such Entry Forms and unless the prescribed fees accompany them.
3. Cheques or Postal Orders to be made payable to Gorey Agricultural Show.
4. Exhibitors alone are responsible for the correctness of entries and are requested to write them clearly and distinctly. The Secretary shall not be responsible for the accuracy of entries received over telephone.
5. Entries are only accepted on the understanding that there shall be no appeal beyond the Committee of the Show, whose decision shall be final.
6. All Exhibits must be in their places not later than 10.30 a.m.
7. Exhibitors may enter the same exhibit in the Cattle and Horse Section in as many classes as they are eligible for, provided that they pay the necessary entry fee in each class.
8. The Committee reserve the right to refuse any Entry unconditionally. A Meeting of the Committee for passing of Entries before going to Press will be held immediately after date of closing, and no Entry Fee will be refunded after the Entries have gone to Press.
9. Age of Animal to be correctly stated at Entry Date from 1st January except where otherwise stated.
10. Exhibits to be Bona-Fide property of the Exhibitor.
11. Pure-bred Cattle means Cattle entered or eligible for entry in Herd Book or respective Breeds, pedigree to be stated in Entry Form. In case of Bulls, the number of the Sire in the Herd Book and the breeding of the Dam to be G.G. Dam also to be set forth on Entry Form.
12. An Exhibitor to appear in more than one Class must have a number for each Class.
13. In the interest of safety, competitors, exhibitors, stand holders and visitors must comply with any safety instructions given by stewards.
14. Exhibitors accept that the Judges decision is final in all cases. Any abuse of Judges will not be tolerated.
15. The Judges may withhold Prizes for want of merit, but only in extreme cases will this be resorted to.
16. No second prize in case of less than three entries, and no third prize in case of less than five entries, unless in the opinion of the Judges there is sufficient merit shown.
17. The Committee reserve the right to abandon or postpone the Show.
18. In the event of the appointed Judge not being available on the day of the Show the Committee reserve the right to appoint a Judge.
19. Objections must be lodged in writing with the Show Secretary within half an hour following the completion of judging, together with a fee of €50, which is refundable in the event of the objection being upheld.,

Passports of all competing mares must be brought to the qualifying Show for scrutiny by the judges. If correct passports are not available for inspection at the time of judging, the mare and foal will not be eligible to compete.

Points will be awarded as follows:

Mare - Maximum 40 marks

Foal - Maximum 60 marks

A mare and foal which has already qualified for the final may not qualify a second time. The 1st, 2nd and 3rd prize winners from each qualifier will be eligible to compete in the final of this Championship which will take place during the Fáilte Ireland Dublin Horse Show (3 - 7 of August 2011).

Racing injuries, blemishes etc. are not taken into consideration in these classes. Bad manners from either horse and/or rider, may result in competitors being asked to leave the ring. In the event of a tie the judges preference will decide the overall winner.

T.B.

All animals must come from herds which are not restricted and the herd and relevant animals must have had a clear test within the previous twelve months.

No pre-movement test is required for T.B. However, it is recommended by the Department that a 30 day pre-movement test for TB should apply to all Shows.

Brucellosis

- (a) All animals must come from herds, which are not restricted.
- (b) Certain animals (i.e. females aged 18 months and over and bulls aged 24 months and over) must have passed a test for Brucellosis within the previous 60 days. However, these animals may move to any number of Shows within the validity period of the same 60-day pre-movement test.

Where an animal(s) is/are being shown repeatedly during successive 60-day validity periods, in the course of a Show season, the animal(s) may be allowed to move on foot of Permit ER 36A during the unexpired portion of a valid test where the animal is under test for the next validity period and the identity card/passport is held by the DVO/practitioner.

Identification

All cattle must bear double plastic tags as issued under the Department's identification system. They must be accompanied by their passports (except in the circumstances outlined in the preceding sub-paragraph).

Bulls for A.I. Stations

In addition to the T.B. and Brucellosis tests, bulls destined for A.I. stations must be tested for I.B.R. (Infectious Bovine Rhinotracheitis), E.B.L. (Enzootic Bovine Leukosis), B.V.D. (Bovine Virus Diarrhoea) and Johnes Disease, within 30 days prior to movement into such stations.

AIM Notification

The movement of Irish-registered cattle to and from an Agricultural Show within the State must be recorded on AIM using form CMMS 4 (available from local DVOs). Ultimate responsibility for fulfilling this requirement lies with the Show Secretary.

The keeper of the animal(s) should complete sections 2 and 3(a) of the CMMS 4 form while Section 3(b) should be completed by the Show Secretary. Completed forms should be sent to the District Veterinary Office in the county where the Show is being held with 7 days of movement.

Imports from Northern Ireland

It is very important that any proposal to import cattle to a show is made known to the local District Veterinary Office in advance so that consideration can be given to compliance with the requirements outlined below.

SPECIFIC REQUIREMENTS - SHEEP**

Identification

All sheep must be identified individually with appropriate ear tags issued in accordance with the requirements of the National Sheep Identification System (NSIS).

Movement Documentation.

All consignments of sheep being moved must be accompanied by a completed dispatch document. Individual details of each sheep in the consignment must be recorded on the document. Sheep from non-restricted flocks only can be moved to shows. In the case of flocks restricted following diagnosis of scrapie, sheep possessing the ARR/ARR genotype only may be exhibited. The movement of these ARR/ARR genotype sheep must be accompanied by the relevant movement permit (SCR/10), which can be obtained from the local District Veterinary Office in the county where the flock is located.

Flock Register

All movements of sheep to and from shows must be recorded in the keeper's flock register.

Exports to Northern Ireland

All sheep must be accompanied by a TRACES intra trade certificate for ovine animals. A TRACES message, corresponding with the TRACES certificate, will be sent for each animal or consignment being dispatched to the show (this will be performed by the Department officials of the DVO). exhibitors are advised to contact the show society in Northern Ireland well in advance of any show to determine the suitability of the show for return of animals (e.g. premises and sheep status), and whether the authorities will have officials and veterinary staff present to supervise and process documentation for animals returning to origin.

Agreement for the movement and immediate return of sheep to a Show in another country or vice versa currently applies for movements between Ireland and Northern Ireland only - it does not apply for movements to Great Britain or further afield. Movements to shows other than Northern Ireland, will be dealt with on a case-by-case basis and you should contact your local District Veterinary Office at least one month prior to the Show.

Attendance of sheep from scrapie monitored flocks at shows and sales in 2010 Shows between 1st May and 31st October

Sheep from Scrapie Monitored Flocks will be permitted to attend Agricultural Shows taking place between 1st May and 31st October, without restriction or separation from other categories of sheep.
